

# LE MUNDE



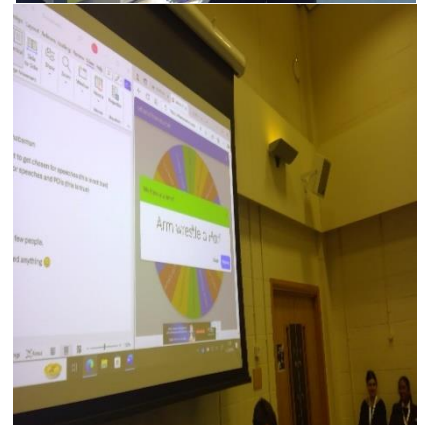
